Following our conversation at yesterday's meeting in Knowle library I would like to comment on proposed Golden End development. I have several objections - not least of which is the destruction of the last remaining old lane in Knowle which is loved and used by many (locals and others), but perhaps the most important and drastic is the impact of vehicles. Looking to the future I see an absolute explosion of vehicles when the children of

settlers in Knowle become of age. There is already gridlock on Kenilworth Rd and Hampton Rd since the development of Hampton Rd site a few years ago. The entrance/exit is too narrow and results in jams and frayed tempers. There is barely room to pass. At the moment there are many young families but when the children reach driving age it will be totally impossible.

The developers will then begin to look at the WET MEADOW (a site of Specific Interest) as a means of escape with the widening of Kixley have as possible next step. Which would include removal of several very mature trees.
